BEING ABLE TO TAKE THOR'S PAIN AWAY—AND GIVE HIM BACK HIS CHILDHOOD

Thor's parents were heartbroken when they found out their newborn baby had sickle cell anemia.

Their son's only hope for a cure is a stem cell transplant from a genetically matched marrow donor—someone willing to step up to save a stranger. They're fighting for their son's life, and they need our help—not just for Thor, but for every patient desperate to find their life-saving match.

And thanks to our mission supporters, Be The Match is there—supporting patients, advancing the science, providing solutions to increase access to treatment and help more patients live longer, healthier lives.

But Thor's family is facing an additional challenge because of his ethnic background. Patients are most likely to match donors who share their ethnic ancestry, but currently, there are not enough Black or African American donors on the registry. Black patients only have a 23% chance of finding a match, compared to a 77% chance for White patients.

We need everyone's help to improve those odds and give every patient the same chance to find a cure.

## FIGHTING TO SAVE THE LIFE OF A COWORKER AND FRIEND

When WeWork® employee Valerie Batista was unable to find a life-saving match—due in part to her Mexican-American heritage—she became resigned to dying. She even reached out to WeWork's legal counsel for help creating her last will and testament.

That's when WeWork CEO Adam Neumann and Rebekah Neumann, his wife and founding partner, ramped up their efforts. They saw that diversifying the registry called for bold, creative solutions.

WeWork partnered with Be The Match to host multiple registration drives around the world including in the U.S., Israel and the U.K., sharing talent from its data resources, salesforce, and communications teams.

To date, more than 1,000 WeWork employees and members in the U.S. have joined the Be The Match Registry in hopes of helping Valerie and others like her.

## BRUNO

Bruno is only 4 months old, and has a rare and life-threatening condition called hemophagocytic lymphohistiocytosis (HLH). Currently, there are no genetically matched marrow donors for Bruno on the Be The Match Registry. His best hope is to add more registry members who share his Mexican heritage.

### INTRODUCING BE THE MATCH MEXICO

The likelihood of finding a matched adult marrow donor on the Be The Match Registry for a patient of Mexican ethnic background is currently about 46%. To reduce this gap and help more Latino patients like Valerie and Bruno, we launched Be The Match Mexico in 2017.

FIGHTING FOR EVERY PATIENT'S RIGHT TO ACCESS THE BEST, CUTTING-EDGE TREATMENT

Jason Carter had leukemia for  $4\frac{1}{2}$  years and passed away in May 2016, at age 28.

In 2017, the Carter family chose to honor Jason's legacy by making a gift of \$1.25 million to the Be The Match Foundation to launch the Jason Carter Clinical Trials Program. Their support made it possible to create a userfriendly website to help patients and their families find clinical trials for all blood cancers and other diseases often treatable by blood stem cell transplantation. It also supports a new clinical trial patient education specialist to provide one-on-one support for patients and families.





HOW IT WOULD FEEL IF CHOOSING LIFE MEANT FINANCIAL RUIN

When doctors told Matt McCallum that he had acute myeloid leukemia and needed a transplant, his first thought was not about survival—it was about health care costs. "I looked at my fiancée, Gabi, and said, 'I am so sorry – we're ruined," he said. "I understand if you want to leave."

With Gabi by his side, Matt spent the next month in the hospital trying to figure out how they were going to take on the immense expenses associated with his treatment.

Fortunately, Matt qualified for Medicare and Medicaid and received a Be The Match Foundation Transplant Support Assistance Grant. His family and friends also supported him with fundraisers.

"We are so grateful for a grant program like this to help us shoulder the financial burden."

As Matt and Gabi continued to work through finances, his medical team worked with Be The Match to find him a life-saving marrow donor, and he received a transplant in October 2014.

During his recovery, he and Gabi received some wonderful news—they'd won a wedding from a resort in their home state of Oregon. "Our wedding was such a win for us—it was amazing," he said. "It was a huge celebration of my transplant being successful."



## **MATT MEETS HIS DONOR**

Last summer, Matt and Gabi traveled to Germany to meet his donor, Michael. "Being able to thank him was the icing on the cake. It is unbelievable that this is even possible, that this network exists, and that people like

# LEGISLATIVE POLICY AND ADVOCACY EFFORTS

Policy and advocacy is critically important in protecting access and expanding coverage for patients in need of a life-saving blood stem cell transplant. Be The Match is committed to enlisting the public's support to advance our mission through legislative and policy action.

#### These efforts include:

- Increase federal funding for the National Cord Blood Inventory and the C.W. Bill Young Cell Transplantation Program (Be The Match Registry), to expedite time to transplant, refine targeted recruitment efforts, and propel innovation for improved outcomes.
- Ensure access to transplant by evaluating and advocating on legislative actions that might harm patient's access to life-saving transplant. Insurance status, race, and income shouldn't determine if you have access to life-saving treatment.
- Protect Medicare patient's access to transplant by reforming the payment system.

### **RELATED DONOR SERVICES**


Zion was born with sickle cell anemia. His only hope for a healthy future was a blood stem cell transplant. His mother, Chim, was chosen to be his donor, but Zion's transplant center was not set up to perform the bone marrow collection. Be The Match coordinated Chim's donation through our Related Donor Services Program. The day after her donation, she was able to be at her son's bedside while he received her life-saving cells.

Related Donor Services provide families access to our expertise to facilitate transplants involving relatives.

#### These services include:

- Sample collecting for HLA typing family members
- Related donor workup and stem cell collection
- Donor and patient benefits, resources and support



# RECEIVING THE GIFT OF A SECOND CHANCE AT LIFE AND CHOOSING TO PAY IT FORWARD.

In 2004, Michael was feeling fatigued. As someone who "works too much" and travels a lot, feeling tired was normal, but this time something felt "off." Michael's intuition was right. His doctors diagnosed him with hairy cell leukemia. He received treatment until he felt back to normal. His leukemia had come and gone, and Michael was ready to move on.

But in 2013, the fatigue returned. This time, is was myelodysplastic syndrome (MDS). Michael was admitted to ICU, in need of a lifesaving marrow transplant.

None of Michael's siblings were a full genetic marrow match. His doctor started a search of the Be The Match Registry. Multiple matches were identified, but several of the potential donors backed out for various reasons. Finally, a 24-year-old woman on the registry said "yes." She was a 10 out of 10 match.

Michael's transplant took place on New Year's Eve, giving him the most amazing way possible to ring in the New Year.

Today, Michael is back to working full time and traveling. As he reflects on his transplant journey, Michael says he had it "easy" compared to so many other patients who endure a long and frightening process, with no guarantee of a happy ending.

Michael's gratitude for his recovery inspired him to "pay it forward" by making a financial gift of \$25,000 to help other patients and their families.



# HONORING DR. JEFFREY CHELL

CEO EMERITUS, BE THE MATCH 2000-2017

In 2017, outgoing CEO Dr. Jeffrey Chell was presented the Jeffrey Mark Harris Achievement Award in recognition of his outstanding contributions in advancing our organization's life-saving mission during his tenure, including:

- Annual transplants increased from 1,672 to 6,166
- Created Center for International Blood and Marrow Transplant Research® in 2004 in partnership with the Medical College of Wisconsin
- 44 clinical trials opened with the participation of 10,000 transplant recipients
- Registry grew from 4 million to 19 million
- Added 238,000 cord blood units to the Be The Match Registry
- Grants awarded—\$350 million

"Dr. Chell's vision, compassion and tenacity coalesced to propel Be The Match forward as a leader in the field of transplantation. His leadership positioned us to have a lasting impact on an international scale and, more importantly, on an individual level for the thousands of patients who found a cure while he was at the helm.
