

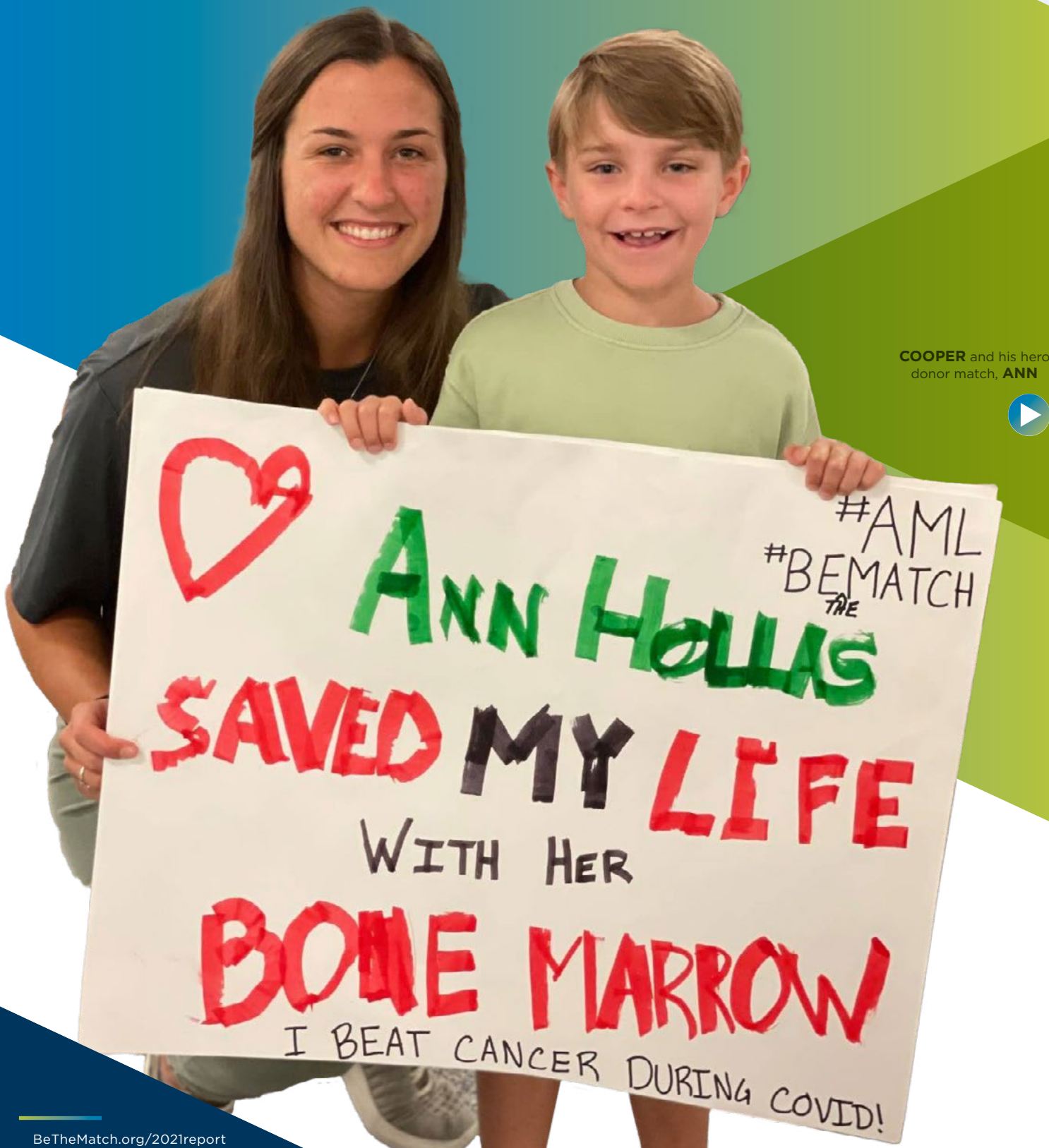

- And we were **named in the top three "best places to work"** by the Minneapolis/St. Paul Business Journal, giving a nod to our fantastic employees and engagement levels.

We see what really matters—patients needing more hope and seeking more second chances than ever before. Patient families and friends needing hope to ensure they have more tomorrows. 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2021: A year of possibility



JANUARY:

We celebrated the 100th blood stem cell collection at the Seattle Collection Center. This state-of-the-art facility provides an enhanced experience and greater collection capacity in the Northwest to support our wonderful donors.



MARCH:

Match Madness campaign launched to recruit 3,000 new potential life savers to join the registry.



MAY:

Legislation passed to reauthorize the C.W. Bill Young Cell Transplantation Program, which provides life-saving bone marrow and umbilical cord blood transplants to patients in need.



JUNE:

Robin Roberts co-hosts "Jeopardy!" and selects Be The Match to receive proceeds. By leveraging this exciting moment with a "Daily Double" fundraising challenge, we raised a total of \$376,957 to provide 184 patients in need with financial assistance.



JULY:

With \$3.4 million, the largest donation in Be The Match history, the Harper Family Patient Access Fund was established, providing financial resources to patients and families in need and accelerating groundbreaking research to increase the odds of finding a suitable match for every patient that needs one.



AUGUST:

Be The Match was recognized by Minneapolis/St. Paul Business Journal in the top three "best places to work." This recognition spotlights organizations that embody dynamic work culture, mission-driven community, and an outstanding employee experience. At Be The Match, we play different roles, but we all have the same job: saving the lives of patients who depend on us.



SEPTEMBER:

Be The Match is leading a research trial focused on one of the most disruptive advancements in the transplant industry. In September 2021, we celebrated a significant milestone, enrolling the first patient in this groundbreaking initiative. (See page 13.)

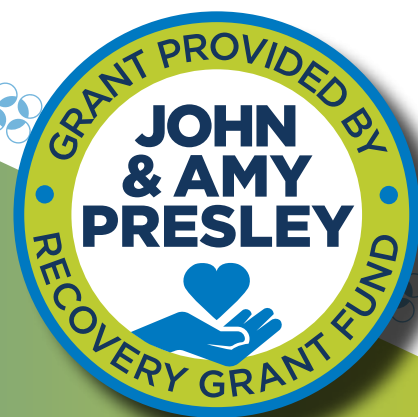


NOVEMBER:

John and Amy rally their community to deliver more healing



When John Presley was diagnosed with acute lymphoblastic leukemia (ALL) in February 2016, his best chance of survival was a bone marrow transplant.

In November 2016, after three grueling rounds of chemotherapy and finding a well-matched donor, John received his transplant.

Today, John and his family are dedicating their time and resources to help other patients receive the life-saving treatment they so desperately need. With a personal donation of \$50,000, they established the John & Amy Presley Recovery Grant Fund that provides patients and families tangible financial support as they navigate through their transplant journey.

“Because of Be The Match’s work, I’ve gotten four more years with Amy and I’ve been able to see my son, Max, finish high school and move on to college,” said John.



For many patient families, the economic impact of the pandemic has been nothing short of devastating as many are bearing the financial weight of uninsured transplant costs.

Their \$50,000 donation was just the start. John and Amy also called on their personal network to join them in supporting Be The Match, raising more than \$150,000 for patient assistance. And because of their incredible life-saving work, we were proud to recognize the Presleys with the 2021 Simplify Award at The ONE Forum®.

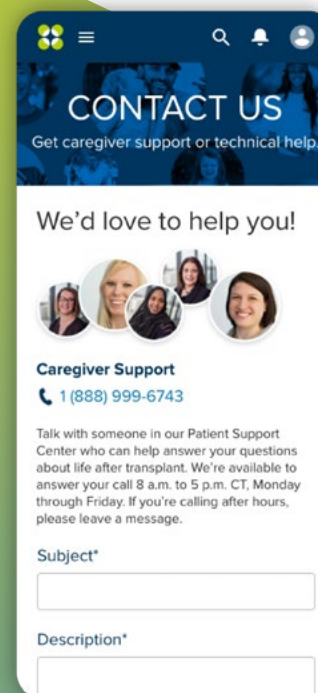
HOSA selects Be The Match as philanthropy partner

Health Occupations Students of America (HOSA)—Future Health Professionals is a student-led organization for those planning to enter the medical field. HOSA selected Be The Match as their designated philanthropy partner for the 2020-2021 school year. Despite challenges due to the pandemic, more than 330 chapters with approximately 2,000 HOSA members participated in raising more than \$120,000 and recruiting nearly 2,000 new registry members, the largest impact any student organization has had with Be The Match.



Laura's legacy

When their 10-year-old daughter, Laura, was diagnosed with leukemia, Robert Graves, D.V.M., and his wife, Sherry, were ready to do anything they could to save her. They agreed to try the first-ever bone marrow transplant for a leukemia patient from an unrelated donor. Laura received her transplant in 1979—and it worked. The success of the treatment inspired the Graves to give other families the same hope for a cure, and a national registry of volunteers willing to donate bone marrow was born—what we know today as Be The Match.



New App for Caregivers

With a generous grant from Kite Pharma, a new caregiver version of the My Be The Match (MyBTM) mobile app launched in November 2021. Now caregivers have access to track and manage their own health and well-being symptoms, connect with a community of caregiving peers and access educational materials to navigate their journey alongside the patient they are caring for.



Gala brings record-breaking support for patients in need

On October 1, 2021, we came together as a community, breaking fundraising records so we could continue Saying “Yes!” to patients in need.

At a time when patients need assistance more than ever, our friends and supporters showed up to the virtual 2021 Be The Match Gala to demonstrate their personal commitment to removing barriers for patients on their journey to healing.

Through this inspiring virtual event, we reached more people from all around the world, increasing awareness of our life-saving mission. And with 890 registered guests and 4,068 unique gala livestream viewers, a record-breaking \$1,110,987.92 was raised to support patients.

Diagnosed with a rare form of leukemia, Zeke began the fight of his life in March 2020—right when the pandemic reached the United States. Then, two selfless strangers stepped up to donate their bone marrow, giving Zeke a second chance at life.

Because of his incredible marrow donors, Zeke’s family had hope. And that hope turned into joy when Zeke got to spend the holidays, not in the hospital, but with his family.

Zeke and his parents had the incredible opportunity to meet the second marrow donor who stepped up to save Zeke’s life on stage at the 2021 Be The Match Gala—making the promise of possibilities even more powerful.

Zeke’s second donor, Marc, joined the Be The Match Registry® for his best friend, Clint, who battled leukemia.

Although Clint ultimately passed away, Marc believes Clint’s legacy lives on through his stem cell donation. When he received the call to donate for Zeke, he said “Absolutely” and never looked back.

When Marc joined Zeke and his parents on stage to meet for the very first time, Zeke ran into his arms. And just like that, the entire room, the virtual Gala audience, and Zeke’s parents were in tears.

The Harper Family Foundation inspires generosity

We’re beyond grateful for the Harper Family Foundation representatives who served as honorary chairs of the 2021 Be The Match Gala and the foundation’s history-making gift of \$3.4 million that is expanding access to life-saving cellular therapies.

Thanks to their generous support and matching gift challenge, every single dollar raised at the 2021 Be The Match Gala was doubled for twice the impact. And to celebrate their history-making impact in 2021, the Harper Family Foundation received a dedicated space on the Be The Match History Wall.



Removing barriers with history-making patient assistance

As the pandemic continued in 2021, so did the uncertainty patients and families were facing

Among a host of unknowns, patient families were met with barriers to healing, namely, the uninsured costs associated with transplant—but Be The Match was there to help.

Each day, we receive 10-15 grant requests* from patients in need of financial support. And today we give out an average 100 more grants per month than we did before the pandemic.** At its height, the need reached a 91% increase over the number of requests we received the prior year.***

In response, we provided \$6.1 million in patient assistance to 2,602 families—the most we've ever provided in a single year.

This critical resource and lifeline are only made possible through philanthropy, and through the generosity and kindness of people like you.

RUDY overcomes big obstacles to save a little life



Transplants can't wait for nice weather

Rodolfo (Rudy) Aguilar lives in Mexico but works as an ICU nurse at a hospital on the U.S. side of the border in Texas. He had been on the Be The Match Registry for six years when Rudy received word that he was a suitable match for a child who required a transplant as soon as possible.

He was scheduled to drive to San Antonio for his donation February 15—the same day Texas was hit by the worst winter storm in modern history. But with the clock ticking and the storm still raging, Rudy strapped himself into a helicopter and embarked on the hour and a half trip to San Antonio with a Texas Department of Public Safety escort.

While the helicopter escort was exciting for Rudy, even more exciting was being able help a little girl on the other side of the border whose blood disease didn't care if it was snowing or not.

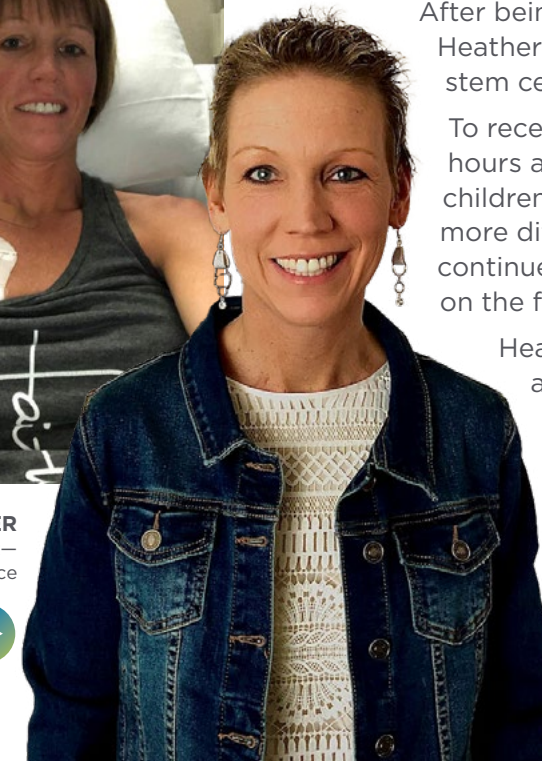


Grant helps Heather focus on recovery

After being diagnosed with chronic myeloid leukemia (CML), Heather was told her best chance for a cure would be a blood stem cell transplant.

To receive her transplant, Heather had to relocate nearly five hours away from home for four months. Sadly, Heather's four children could not relocate with her. And to make things even more difficult, Heather's husband had to quit his job to continue as her caregiver, putting additional financial strain on the family.

Heather's family was relieved to receive a patient assistance grant from Be The Match, made possible through philanthropy. She shares this gift was "incredibly helpful between travel and extra expenses in relocating," and notes, "it really helped bridge the financial gap."

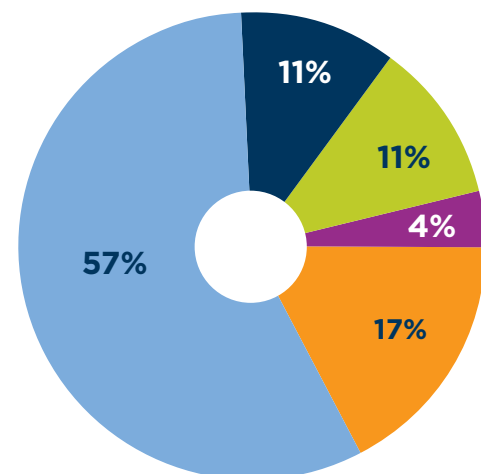

2021 Amy Scholars

Amy Strelzer Manasevit Research Program

The Amy Strelzer Manasevit Research Program (Amy Program) is Be The Match's prize research fellowship. The Amy Program awards funding to early career investigators focused on advances in the prevention and treatment of post-cell-therapy complications, like graft-versus-host disease and other infections.

Since 1998, Be The Match Foundation has invested nearly \$12 million to help launch the careers of 46 young physician-scientists. The Amy Program is considered a launch pad and this group has gone on to win more than \$110 million in subsequent funding.

Amy Scholars are recognized leaders in the field, pursuing scientific advances that help Be The Match patients live longer, healthier lives. Meet the scholars awarded in 2021:

HLA Today

Our HLA Today initiative, with a generous grant from AstraZeneca, is improving patient outcomes, especially among ethnically diverse patients. By initiating patient HLA typing and a donor search at diagnosis, physicians get a head start on developing the best possible treatment plan, and patients have earlier access to Be The Match resources and support.

Powering our mission through innovation



DONOR FOR ALL: Patients are most likely to match marrow donors who share the same ethnic background. However, many ethnicities are severely underrepresented on the Be The Match Registry. For our ethnically diverse patients, that means the odds of finding the current required 8/8 human leukocyte antigen (HLA) match can be as low as 19%, creating a disparity in access to a potentially life-saving transplant.

Backed by philanthropy, Be The Match is leading a research trial, also known as the ACCESS study. This trial expands the use of donors beyond the current 8/8 HLA match requirement, increasing options for patients who may have previously had none. In 2021, a significant milestone was reached when the first patient was enrolled in the study and \$1.7 million was raised to accelerate this critical research.

Ramesh is a husband, father, Be The Match Foundation board member and a blood stem cell transplant recipient.

At a routine physical, Ramesh was surprised when his blood work came back as abnormal. After further testing, he was ultimately diagnosed with lymphoma. A blood stem cell transplant was his best chance for a cure. So his doctors got to work right away to find Ramesh's donor match.

Looking back, Ramesh is grateful he and his wife didn't know his odds of finding a donor match were much lower due to his ethnic background. They were shocked and grateful to learn that on the worldwide registry of 39 million potential donors, Ramesh had just one match. And, his donor match, Hari, was willing to go forward with donation.

In 2021, Hari and Ramesh finally had the opportunity to meet for the first time. Reflecting on it all, Hari says, "It feels like a dream."

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Couriers receive new bags thanks to generous partners

One of the most important aspects of a transplant is ensuring the donor cells get delivered to the waiting patient safely and quickly. Fortunately, we have an outstanding group of more than 700 volunteer couriers, specially trained to take on whatever obstacles they might encounter along the trip.

Couriers transport blood stem cells in a cooler bag, but the bags were outdated, uncomfortable and not designed with travel in mind. But with generous support from Incyte and Omeros, we were able to acquire new, redesigned courier bags to keep these life-saving trips running smoothly.

The new bags have an improved zipper system, better organized pockets, a reinforced bottom and a sleeve, which allows the cooler bag to be safely attached to a roller bag. And to recognize our longstanding partnerships, the new bags proudly feature Be The Match, Omeros and Incyte logos on the side.
